Platform Responsibility in the EU: From Article 17 of the DSM © Directive to the forthcoming Digital Service Act

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DSM Copyright Directive/Article 17 Value Gap or Trap?



- ◎ A controversial, hotly contested Directive − 6 MSs voted against
- © Transposition deadline: 7 June 2021
- © Article 17: OCSSPs CttP and do not get the hosting privilege (Article 14 ECD)
 - © So authorisation/prohibition apply but if no license...
 - © ...Best efforts to license, filtering and staydown → new safe harbour
 - Built in proportionality mechanism and liability holidays for start-ups
 - © RH-OSCCP coop 'shall' not prevent non-infringing uses
 - Complaint and Redress to right wrongs not wrong rights
 - O Neither Lex Specialis nor Sui Generis
 - AG Opinion in YouTube/Uploaded
 - © European Commission to issue misguidance
- © Implementation slow but chugging along (1/3 MSs have draft laws)
- © Issues: Legal nature, Best efforts, AP, contractual freedom (ECLs), and exceptions

Digital Services Act (DSA) – cue the new safe harbours!?

- © Update the horizontal regulatory framework for digital services/platforms in the EU
- © 2 Legislative Proposals Liability and Ex Ante Regulation of Gatekeepers
- © For Liability -- clarify the E-Commerce Directive regime:
 - © New safe harbour(s) jettison 'outdated' active/passive doctrine?
 - Infrastructure (traditional hosts but maybe others) stay in Article 14 while
 - © Online platforms and others (search engines?) move into new refuges
 - Question of control becomes key determining factor
 - New due diligence obligations (duties of care)?
 - © Notice and Action (Staydown?)
 - © Transparency
 - © KYBC (online marketplaces and more?)
 - © Good (EU) Samaritan: remove disincentives to do what they can already do
- © Protecting users' fundamental rights against overzealous private enforcement
- Relationship to Article 17/what impact on copyright and Article 8(3) 2001 CD wiggin
