



**INDEPENDENT FILMS EARN 43 ACADEMY AWARDS NOMINATIONS IN 20 CATEGORIES INCLUDING
THREE UP FOR BEST PICTURE**

***All Quiet on the Western Front, Everything Everywhere All at Once, and Triangle of Sadness*
Lead with the Most Nominations for the Independents**

Los Angeles, CA - January 26, 2023 - Independent films — those made outside the major Hollywood studios — are strong Oscar® contenders this year. The Independent Film & Television Alliance® (IFTA®) is pleased to announce that 20 independent films earned 43 nominations across all 20 feature-length motion picture categories for the 95th Academy Awards.

Six of IFTA's member companies -- Altitude Film Sales, Hanway Films, Huayi Brothers, Mister Smith Entertainment, Participant, and Sierra/Affinity -- were involved in the production, financing, sales and/or distribution of five of this year's independent film nominees. Independents are dominating the nominations for categories including: Best Actor, Best Supporting Actress, Best Original Song, Best Documentary, and Best International Feature. The 95th Oscars will air live on ABC on Sunday, March 12, 2023.
